The following table lists all of the *E. coli* O157:H7 outbreaks known to us that caused serious illness to two or more people and were traced to lettuce and spinach between 1993 and 2008. The table shows that all of the outbreaks since late 1999—when accurate record-keeping began at the FDA—were traced to fresh-cut bagged products.
