CERTIFICATION STAMPS

Purpose

This instruction defines policy, proper use, and application of Meat Grading and Certification (MGC) Branch stamps when certifying products.

Policy

MGC Branch stamps are only applied to products certified by an authorized MGC Branch employee. Imprints will be legible, applied horizontally, and placed so as to not obliterate required markings.
