NOSB Seeks Input on Petitions to Remove Two Forms of Lecithin from the National List

USDA's National Organic Standards Board (NOSB) has received petitions to remove two forms of lecithin from the National List of Allowed and Prohibited Substances.

Although a recommendation on these petitions to remove these forms of lecithin is not expected until the Spring 2009 NOSB meeting, the NOSB is seeking written comment on the suitability of organic forms of lecithin in advance of and during the November NOSB Meeting. The NOSB is soliciting specific technical input from end-users regarding the suitability of the organic forms of lecithin to replace the current uses of synthetic bleached lecithin and liquid forms of unbleached lecithin in organic products.
