Dear Mr. Huber:

In preparation for the upcoming hearing, I request that the Market Administrator's office compile and provide the following information:

- 1. The names and locations of all pool plants, partially regulated plants, and supply plants regulated under the Mideast Order for any month during 2004.
- 2. The names and locations of all producer-handler plants in the Mideast Order during 2004.
- 3. The number of producer-handler plants in the Mideast Order and predecessor orders for the years 1970, 1975, 1980, 1985, 1990, and each year for 1995 to the present.
- 4. The number of producer-handlers in the Mideast Order and predecessor orders with Class I route disposition greater than 3,000,000 pounds per month for each of the years identified above.
- 5. The total Class I disposition of producer-handlers in the Mideast Order and predecessor orders for the years identified above.
- 6. The names and locations of exempt plants in the Mideast Order (less than 150,000 pounds of milk per month) that would be classified as producer-handlers had their volume exceeded 150,000 pounds per month.

- 7. For December of each of 2001, 2002, 2003, and 2004, the statistical uniform price for the Mideast Order calculated as if the volume of Class I milk processed by producer-handlers were obligated to the pool.
- 8. For each month of 2003 and 2004, the Market Administrator's estimate of the volume of milk that was "depooled" from the Mideast Order.
- 9. For each month of 2003 through the present, the Market Administrator's estimate of the statistical uniform price recalculated assuming that Proposal Five were adopted and milk that depooled was excluded from the pool for the following twelve months.

In addition, please provide this office with copies of information requests from other interested parties and the Market Administrator's responses to those requests.
