- 1/ The Small Business Administration defines a dairy farm as a "small business" if it has an annual gross revenue of less than \$750,000 per year, and a dairy products manufacturer as a "small business" if it has fewer than 500 employees. For the purposes of determining which dairy farms are "small businesses," the \$750,000 per year criterion was used to establish a marketings guideline of 500,000 pounds per month. For purposes of determining a handler's size, if the plant is part of a larger company operating multiple plants that collectively exceed the 500-employee limit, the plant is considered a large business even if the local plant has fewer than 500 employees.
- 2/ Nonpool plants are counted once in each order with which they are associated. A nonpool plant associated with two or more orders may have a status under one order that is different than its status under the other orders.
