

# PIG PICKIN' (Basic How To)

### 1 (75 to 100 pound) dressed pig 1/2 pound salt 60 pounds charcoal briquettes, divided

*Barbecue sauce* Split backbone to allow pig to lay flat, being careful

not to pierce skin. Trim and discard any excess fat. Sprinkle salt inside cavity. Set pig aside.

Place 20 pounds charcoal in pork cooker. Pour 1 quart charcoal lighter fluid over top, and ignite. Let burn until charcoal has turned ash-gray. Place heavy gauge wire, about the size of pig, over pork cooker, 13 inches from coals.

Place pig flat, skin side up, on wire surface. Close lid of cooker; cook at 225 degrees for 6 hours, adding additional lighted coals as needed to maintain temperature in cooker.

Place a second piece of wire over pig, sandwiching pig between the 2 layers of wire. Turn pig over. Remove wire from top. Insert meat thermometer in thigh, do not touch bone.

Baste meat with barbecue sauce; pour sauce in rib cavity to measure 1 inch. Close pork cooker lid. Cook at 225 degrees for 2 hours until meat thermometer registers 170 degrees and no pink meat is visible when hams and shoulders are cut.

Slice or chop meat or allow guests to pull (pick) meat from bones. Serve with barbecue sauce. Yield 70 servings. *Compliments of Willis Peaden & Jim Elder N.C. State Barbecue Champions.* 

# **Basting Barbecue Sauce**

6 cups cider vinegar
3 tablespoons Tabasco sauce
6 tablespoons paprika
9 tablespoons salt
3 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
3 tablespoons chili powder or hot pepper flakes
2 cups water
Combine all ingredients in large sauce pan. Bring to boil, reduce heat, and simmer uncovered for an hour

### **Myrtle Beach Conference Travel Plans**

**Flying**—The Myrtle Beach International Airport is located only a few miles inland from the Holiday Inn Downtown Oceanfront hotel. Airlines serving this airport include: Air Tran, ASA/Delta/Comair, Continental, Midway/Corporate, Spirit, US Airways, Vanguard.

These carriers are providing *non-stop* service to Myrtle Beach from Atlanta, Boston, Buffalo/Niagara Falls, Charlotte, Chicago O'Hare, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Detroit, Hartford/Springfield, Newark, NY LaGuardia, Orlando, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Raleigh/Durham, Savannah/Hilton Head, Toronto, and Washington Dulles.

The hotel is about a 10 minute ride from the airport. Taxi rates for the ride should be about \$7.00-8.00 plus \$1.00 for each extra person.

Most major rental car agencies are also located at the airport if you would like to do some sightseeing or visit any of the numerous golf courses in the area.

**Driving**—Coming in on Highway 501 from the West, turn right on 3rd Avenue South, and then turn right on Ocean Boulevard to *415 Ocean Boulevard*. Parking is free in a spacious parking lot in front of the hotel.

We will provide a "Things to do guide" in the registration pack. The hotel is centrally located for the Myrtle Beach area, with several entertainment and dinning options within walking distance.
