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# USDA Grass Fed Program For Small and Very Small (SVS) Producers

#### 1 Purpose

This Procedure and Application outlines the responsibilities and requirements of individuals or companies requesting to participate in the Agricultural; Marketing Service, Grass Fed Program for Small and Very Small (SVS) producers.

#### 2 Scope

The provisions of this Procedure apply to small and very small producers/individuals or farms/ranches who participate in the USDA Grass Fed Program and for marketing animals that are in conformance to the USDA Grass Fed Program. The Scope also includes the review and approval of requesting participants.

#### 3 References

Grass (Forage) Fed Marketing Claim Standard (October 16, 2007, Federal Register Notice (72 FR 58631). Grass (Forage) Fed—Grass and forage shall be the feed source consumed for the lifetime of the ruminant animal, with the exception of milk consumed prior to weaning. The diet shall be derived solely from forage consisting of grass (annual and perennial), forbs (e.g., legumes, Brassica), browse, or cereal grain crops in the vegetative (pre-grain) state. Animals cannot be fed grain or grain byproducts and must have continuous access to pasture during the growing season. Hay, haylage, baleage, silage, crop residue without grain, and other roughage sources may also be included as acceptable feed sources. Routine mineral and vitamin supplementation may also be included in the feeding regimen. If incidental supplementation occurs due to inadvertent exposure to non-forage feedstuffs or to ensure the animal's well-being at all times during adverse environmental or physical conditions, the producer must fully document (e.g., receipts, ingredients, and tear tags) the supplementation that occurs including the amount, the frequency, and the supplements provided.

#### 4 Responsibilities

Individuals and farms/ranches must meet all applicable policies and procedures outlined in this Procedure and *QAD 1000 Procedure*, *Quality Systems Verification Program General Policies and Procedure*, except as modified in this Procedure. 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#### 5 Audit Frequency

Applications will undergo a desk audit for initial approval for group(s) of animals. Each subsequent group of animals will be required to undergo a desk audit for approval. Due to individual complexities of operations on onsite audit might be required to ensure conformance to the Grass Fed Standard.

#### 6 Definition of Small or Very Small

This program is designed to provide grass fed verification services to small and very small operations. Using the smallest group identified in the Farms, Land in Farms and Livestock Operations 2012 Summary (February 2013), National Agricultural Statistics Service chart "Number of Cattle and Calves Operations and Percent of Inventory by Size Group – United States: 2011 and 2012", to be considered for this program a producer would need to market 49 cattle or less each year in order to qualify. AMS would consider on a case by case basis if a cattle producer is over but very close to this number whether this verification process could be used.
