- Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) are farming practices to minimize the risk of microbial food safety hazards on fruits and vegetable products.
- GAP is important to farmers because many large-volume buyers, traders, and retailers require that their suppliers have a GAP certificate.
- The certificate verifies that a farm is following certain U.S. Food and Drug Administration food safety recommendations and industry-recognized food safety practices.

The discussion will cover a review of the GAP 101 webinar presented in March 2014, and then dive deeper into the GAP audit and Good Manufacturing Principles (GMP) on farms and in packing and processing facilities.
